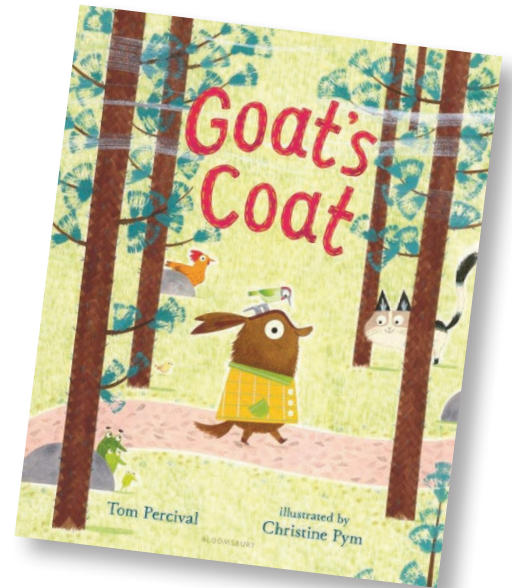


10 WAYS TO EXPLORE THIS BOOK

Goat's Coat

- 1 **CREATE** a list of words that rhyme.
- 2 **NAME** all the animals in the book.
- 3 **TALK** about making friends.
- 4 **READ** or recite “The 3 Billy Goats Gruff”.
- 5 **FIND** a sweater or coat and retell the story.
- 6 **SHARE** the story with a friend.
- 7 **COUNT** the number of animals in the book.
- 8 **IMITATE** the action words (pranced, skipped, etc.).
- 9 **THINK** about what you have that you could give up to help people.
- 10 **DISCUSS** the letter Z from Alfonzo’s name. How do you write it? What does it sound like?

FIVE WAYS TO DISCOVER ANY BOOK WITH A CHILD

Talk about what the book makes you both think or feel.

2

Sing a song that is related to a character or something in the book.

3

Act out parts of the story.

4

Draw a picture of something that happened in the book.

5

Retell the story using the illustrations.
